

 - Ga West
 - Ga Central
- Inhabitants:
 - 2010: 871,886
 - 2020: 1,300,000







Sanitation

Faecal Sludge from the Prisons end up in the Densu River

Wastewater treatment


- Only 17% of the wastewater is treated.
- In the project area central sewerage systems are almost non-existing.
- Few (institutional) waste water projects are functioning.
- Nsawam Prison (8,000 inmates + staff) has 1 defunct treatment plant.
- Issues: maintenance, unavailability of skilled staff and/or a non-viable business case

Nutrient recycling

Energy and nutrients from waste water disappear.

To improve the living conditions of 300,000 people through improved sanitation, waste water treatment and recycling














The re-cycling chain of waste water Business case The Special Treat Project Ghana







- 1. Feb 2015 Application to Netherlands Enterprise Agency (RVO) under Ghana Netherlands WASH Programme (GNWP)
- 2. July 2015 Approval from RVO for 70% funding
- July 2015 January 2016 ext. to 1st September 2016 -Inception Phase to prepare plan for implementation and submit report
- 4. October 2016 Feedback from RVO for additional documents
- 5. 14 March 2017– Final approval from RVO for implementation
- 6. JV in process of finalizing registration
